



Joining pack for SRC VHF Radio Course

Course date:

Start time: 09:30

Whilst you attend this one day RYA SRC Radio Course you shall be taught the essentials of VHF Radio operation, the correct channels to use in whichever situation may occur, emergency and medical assistant procedures, ship to shore telephone calls, and how to make a distress call. Also you will have one whole day to ask your instructor any questions relating to VHF, such as 'what is the best equipment for your own boat?'

At the end of the course students will have been prepared to take a short exam. This however is nothing to feel anxious about; the RYA exam has a high pass rate. After passing the exam you will be issued within 28 days from the RYA by post, with the '*United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland Certificate of Competence and Authority to Operate*'. Cost of this certificate is not included in the course fee so you will be required to bring your payment or payment details the fee of £30 this will be sent to the RYA on the same day that you complete the course.

The course is held in a fully equipped classroom which accommodates the need of the course structure, we can also provide hot and cold refreshments. The Centre is facilitated with toilets and car parking, the car park is relatively secure however due to groups arriving and departing to use the swimming pool '*On The Water Training Ltd*' and its '*Staff*' are not liable for any damage or loss.

Things you will need on the day:

- 1 Passport photograph for licence
- £30 RYA fee (card or cheque)
- RYA membership number (only applicable to RYA members)
- Medical Declaration form
- Lunch however there is a small paper shop local which sales the basics
- Pen and Paper

Arrival

The day will start at 09.30 and will finish 16.30 at the latest (on average the course runs over eight hours, with a one hour lunch break).

When you arrive you shall be greeted in the Centre's entrance (see *directions* overleaf) by the Course Instructor who shall be expecting you, if for any reason you are running late or have any issues with these times please contact the Centre Principle on 07989699480 who shall inform the Instructor.

Cancellations

All cancellations must be in writing. Payment must be received 28 days before the course. If 3 or more weeks notice is given then you shall receive a full refund. However if less than 3 week's notice is given 100% of the course shall be retained.

'On The Water Training Ltd' reserves the right to postpone, or in extreme cases cancel a course. In the event of cancelling a course, we will try to arrange a suitable date for rescheduling. If this is not possible then we will issue a full refund.

Directions

- From Dorchester - take the *A354* to Weymouth
- From Poole and Bournemouth - take the *A352* to Weymouth
- From Bridport - take the *B3157* to Weymouth
- From Yeovil - take the *A37* to Weymouth

When you arrive at Weymouth take the *A354* to Portland. This will bring you to the causeway running alongside Chesil Beach connecting Portland and Weymouth.

At the end of the causeway, with Chesil Beach on your right hand side, you come to a double roundabout. Take the left turn off the roundabout following signs for All Routes, Castletown and the hospital.

You should now be following a hill for about 500meters, which at the top of the hill will curve round to the right and have a sharp junction to the left, take the left following signs for Castletown and the hospital.

Keep going until you reach another roundabout and on the left you will see large iron gates, turn into these gates and you have arrived at the Osprey leisure centre. The entrance is through the yellow doors where you will be greeted by your instructor.
